Dear Policyholder:

The COVID-19 pandemic has created an unprecedented event in the lives of New Jersey residents and policyholders. New Jersey policyholders who were in good standing on March 1, 2020, but who subsequently suffered financial hardship due to COVID-19 qualify for a 60-day grace period. If you qualify for this grace period, you may elect to have it begin retroactively on April 1, 2020 or May 1, 2020. Those who complete the 60-day emergency grace period will be provided with the option of amortizing any unpaid premium over the remaining months of the policy.

If you have not already contacted your agent or our Company, and are experiencing hardship or difficulties, we encourage you to contact your agent and explore the options that are available.
